

My Story

When I was seven years old, I entered the House of Mercy orphanage in Quebrada Seca, Honduras with my two brothers. My mother was unable to care for us, and at the time I felt worthless. I was a person who stuttered a lot; and because of my insecurities, I didn't want to go to school. Pastor Rubén and Verónica from the orphanage, always told me that I had a lot of potential and read the Word of God to me.

As I was growing, I began getting very good grades in school; and in time, I graduated from 9th grade. Around that time a group of missionaries came with Tim and Nancy Lovelace, who were part of Go To Nations and GloDev. They came to help teach us and build an aquaponic system at the orphanage. During that time, I took the opportunity to work and learn alongside other Go To Nations missionaries about the aquaponics system. It was something wonderful to see. While working, I had the opportunity to meet Wyly and Candace Gammon. Through that relationship, they gave me the opportunity to go to New Destiny School to finish my education and then to go to Go To Nations School of Ministry under Directors Jesse and Sara Eggman and Garito and Gwen Stanley. I learned so much through them; they helped me to understand that I was worth so much more and that I was important to God. I was being connected, and I knew that God had a purpose for my life. They taught me the Word of God, which changed my life forever.

I graduated from high school and also from Go To Nation School of Ministry and served on a mission trip to Haiti with Garito. Today, with the help of all the missionaries and their financial partners, God has taken away the pain of my young life. My mom is proud of me, and I feel very happy that I am doing my missionary apprenticeship in Peru. I do not think that orphanages, schools, and buildings transform the needy, but God does with the help of His people. However, in structures like the House of Mercy orphanage where I was helped, ministry happens and God fulfills His purposes for the man that I am now, and for many others like me.



Go To Nations exists to initiate and accelerate missions ministry on a global scale until every tribe, every tongue, and every nation has heard the Good News of Jesus Christ. Go To Nations, in partnership with the Body of Christ, trains leaders to change nations, ignites the fires of evangelism, brings hope to the hurting, and plants strong national churches. This is accomplished through our worldwide missionary field force and through increasing the ministry capabilities of individuals, churches, and ministries globally.

Founded by Dr. Daniel and Sharon Williams, and incorporated in 1981 as Calvary Ministries International, Go To Nations has grown and developed into having a significant role in missions mobilization in 110 nations around the world. The mission efforts that began in Costa Rica, spread quickly to Ecuador, Mexico, Côte d'Ivoire, Nigeria, Russia, and the Philippines. More than 10,000 nationals were trained in Calvary Bible Schools within the first 10 years. Today, Go To Nations has expanded its worldwide ministry from Bible Schools and church planting to include orphan and elderly care, street evangelism, feeding programs, community transformation projects, discipleship and leadership development programs, and so much more.



10/40 WINDOW

The 10/40 Window is a term referring to the region located north of the equarter between latitudes 10°N to 40°N. This area of the world has the greatest poverty and lowest quality of life, combined with a lack of access to the gospel and Christian resources. The Window forms a band encompassing Saharan and Northern Africa, as well as most of Asia. Roughly two-thirds of the world's population live in the 10/40 Window, and it is predominantly Muslim, Hindu, Buddhist, Jewish, animist, or atheist.

66 90% of our ministry is conducted within the 10/40 window.

IGNITING MOVEMENTS

Go To Nations' sister organization GloDev, Inc., which stands for Global Development, was established in 2012 and began to impact the local community while continuing to train Go To Nations missionaries globally in Community Transformation. In 2016, GloDev purchased 120 acres of land in one of Jacksonville, Florida's forty food deserts, and started building Eden Gardens Farm with the help of volunteers and a small group of Go To Nations missionaries.


Year after year, the number of volunteers, guests, and schools visiting Eden Gardens Farm continues to grow, as well as their reach to Jacksonville and surrounding counties. GloDev was awarded the 2022 St. John's County Business Partner of the Year Award for acquiring funding and installing a greenhouse and aquaponics system for St. John's Technical High School for underserved youth. GloDev partners with local nonprofits and churches to feed our community in need with fresh produce and simple acts of compassion.

With campgrounds, a recreational lake, orchards, greenhouses, and a fresh market, our team is already providing chemical free, responsibly grown food for the community, with the goal of feeding 1,000 people a day, as well as providing students with S.T.E.M. training and Aquaponics certification for schools and people across the U.S. and around the world. Go To Nations has known that we must address the growing needs locally in Jacksonville and across the U.S. due to the breakdown of the family and the decline in moral values, as well as food shortages in every state. Churches across Jacksonville are taking an active role in the community at large, sharing their faith and meeting felt needs. In order to strengthen the reach to our city and network the Body of Christ for global missions, we started a new initiative in 2022 to come alongside our local churches and nonprofits in their efforts to make a difference. Together our strengths are combined and we are able to help serve the tens of thousands of refugees in Jacksonville with English and citizenship classes, back-to-school programs for children, feeding programs, and simply being the hands and feet of Jesus. Our founding members carried a divine understanding that our role in the nations was to equip and mobilize others to bring lasting transformation. Go To Nations missionaries literally came alongside a church in revival in Latin America to train the next generation of ministers. Within ten years, seven Bible schools were operating in seven different nations and had trained over 10,000 ministers. This continued into Russia and within a few years, more than 1,000 ministers had been trained and sent out, planting hundreds of churches where none had existed before and documenting one million souls won for Christ.




Asia, home to more than half of the world's population, steadily grew from an initial school in Manila, to now operating an average of more than 20 Bible schools across a dozen nations in Asia, Africa, and Latin America. Those graduates plant two to four new churches every week where no church had existed before. Ignited movements, multiplying the efforts of Go To Nations missionaries by empowering those we serve, often result in lasting transformational ministry in these same places. On average more than 100,000 at-risk children and young people are impacted every single year through the work of national Go To Nations ministry networks.

Of the half a million people impacted by Go To Nations laborers annually, nearly 1/4 of them are considered at-risk. Tens of thousands are assisted through Disaster Relief efforts and Community Transformation Projects now operating in many of the nations hosting Go To Nations teams. Schools have been started and scholarship programs take impoverished children and youth through High School and even college, while at the same time discipling the parents, in order to break the cycle of poverty and bring lasting change. Orphans are placed in homes, the elderly receive loving care, while English programs, skills development, and community transformation programs all serve these ever expanding movements of compassion.



NOW TO NEXT Our Next 40 Years

Go To Nations is at a gateway as a 40-year organization, moving from *Now* to *Next*. We are committed to succession and a generational strategy. Our first generation of "Pioneers" followed a God-given mandate and laid the foundation for an international ministry. Our second generation of "Builders" created infrastructure for growth and created key partnerships to increase global effectiveness. Our third generation of "Advancers" are now strategically positioned and are already seeing double the results in the last four years as we did in the previous ten years—and they are just getting started. As we advance toward our 2030 and 2040 goals, it will require a multifaceted ministry campus, side-by-side with our sister organization, GloDev Inc., to best meet local and global needs, while equipping people to ignite movements of compassion all over the world.







OUR PLAN

Go To Nations' Relief and Development Arm, GloDev, Inc.—a public charity—donated four acres of the property to Go To Nations so that we can relocate our World Headquarters and build our new Go To Nations Global Missions Center. This positions us for the "generational pass" and destiny of the ministry, as well as places both organizations side-by-side to better meet local needs, affect culture, and provide solutions to global challenges. Bringing both organizations together onto one property will create greater collaboration, synergy and impact, as well as create a model for the world that is scalable, reproducible, and sustainable.

On a global purview, the remaining unreached are the poorest of the poor. In order to help them and bring transformation of lives, families, and communities, we have learned that we must combine holistic training and proven ministry methods that work hand in glove with the presentation of the gospel of Christ.

By building the Global Missions Center on the campus of Eden Gardens, we will create a living model of integrated gospel and practical ministry, running Bible Schools, missionary internships and training programs, alongside an active farm that is meeting felt needs here in Jacksonville and teaching simple food technologies to help the poor help themselves. 
